

The Certificate in Architectural Hardware STAGE ONE

2023 RESULTS


This year 138 students completed the Stage 1 of The Certificate in Architectural Hardware, with 128 of these students passing their online examination.

The passing score is an accumulation of both block assessments and examination. Students must achieve 50%+ in their final exam and an overall score of 60%+.

The marks accumulated in Stage 1 go towards Stage 2 for the combined results in The Certificate in Architectural Hardware. Of the 128 passes, 21 learners achieved over 80%, which will put them in an excellent position for achieving a Distinction next year. A further 58 scored 70% or more which sets them towards a credit. As in past years, the dependency to pass, 50% had to be achieved in the examination.

Of the twenty learners who 'fast tracked' by sitting both Stages 1 and 2 together this year, there were 15 who passed both exams. 4 students decided to defer their Stage 2 studies until 2023/24 and one student is yet to sit this year.

Regular in-company tuition is a vital ingredient for students at all stages, particularly at Stage 1 as the GAI do not offer any classroom training courses, unless requested.

2023 RESULTS


This year has seen 83 learners enrolled on the Stage 2 course including 20 who 'fast tracked' Stages 1 and 2. Of the 83 who took the Stage 2 examination:

- 24 students achieved 60% or more
- 45 students achieved 70% or more
- 7 students who achieved 80% or more.

The Stage 2 examination covers fourteen modules and builds upon subjects from Stage 1. As with Stage 1, online coursework represented 30% of the total marks and students were required to get at least 50% in the examination.

For those who have been unsuccessful in passing The Certificate in Architectural Hardware, there is an opportunity now to enrol for the retake examination, deadline closes for enrolments on Friday 15th December 2023.

Well done to all those who passed who can now progress to Stage 3 of the GAI Diploma or Certificated Standards and Regulations qualification before moving to the final stage of Continuous Professional Development (CPD).

2023 RESULTS

Out of the 46 students, 27 students passed, 13 students achieved a Credit and 7 gained a Distinction. We have a total of 47 new Diploma holders in Scheduling, 21 Diploma holders in Door Systems, 26 Diploma holders in Electric Hardware and Access Control and 3 newly qualified in Certificated Standards and Regulations.

The GAI training course should be a serious consideration for all Stage 3 GAI Diploma in Scheduling students.

We are pleased to report that three of the top four medals this year all attended a GAI three-day classroom training course. In addition, 89% of the students who attended the course passed their final examinations! Well done to you all.

This year sees the first year of the results for the new qualifications, with extremely pleasing results, with just a couple of retake exams, we have 100% pass rate across the board. We do have some clever students in our industry!
